




Did You Know?

The Butt-Holdsworth Memorial Library is excited to announce the purchase of replacement Circulation Desk RFID pads and barcode scanners.

The upgraded equipment will improve accuracy during check-ins and check-outs and allow improved usability when reserving a public computer.

For material check-out, if self-check is preferred, the kiosks remain available.

When using the kiosk, please lay the book completely flat during check-out to deactivate the sensor.

Only new McNaughtons (green strip at the bottom of the book) and children's board books require the white barcode to be scanned. All other materials can be laid flat for check-out.

DVDs/Blu-rays can be checked-out at the Circulation Desk.




Battle of the Books Winner Announced
