City Council took action on a number of items in November, including:

Council approved on first reading an Ordinance annexing a tract of land into the corporate limits of the City of Kerrville, Texas; such property making up approximately 11.93 acres and generally located south of the intersection of State Highway 27 and Colvin Ranch Rd.; more commonly known as 5269 State Highway 27; such property more specifically described in this Ordinance and being located within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of and adjacent to the City Limits; adopting a service agreement; establishing the zoning for the annexed property as an Industrial and Manufacturing (IM) Zoning District; and providing other matters relating to this subject. A second reading is scheduled for Dec. 13.
