

Riverhill Traffic Action Advisory #2

We are moving forward and addressing the long standing and increasing traffic issue on Riverhill Blvd. Input and guidance from the community is essential as it was in the rezoning case. The next step will be to form a committee of Riverhill volunteers to assist in addressing the myriad of issues and challenges associated with this undertaking. The following is a summary of actions taken to date.

- 1. Last week I met with Mayor Eychner and presented an outline of an Action plan and a proposed timetable. In summary, we will form a Committee for Riverhill residents and develop possible solutions and actions to address the problem. These, in turn, will be discussed with and vetted with the appropriate City Department for input and comments. Based on their input our Committee will determine the next steps.
- 2. The Kerrville Police Department completed a traffic survey covering nine days of traffic on Riverhill Blvd. last week and has shared the overall data with me. They may provide the entire study depending on departmental policy. This information will provide a base point and another study will be conducted after school reconvenes later this summer so we can determine the impact of that traffic. This information will be available to the Committee and any Member who is interested.
- 3. An Action Plan similar to the one employed for the response to the recent zoning change request has been completed and will be posted along with other relevant information soon on our website. It will serve as a guideline for the Committee activities.

As was the case in dealing with the rezoning challenge, the key will be the input and involvement of our homeowners. Once again, we are facing an uphill battle and the input and support of all our Members will be vital.
